In Memoriam

In Memory of Nancy Nerbonne

Nancy Nerbonne passed away in early June after a long struggle with ocular melanoma. From the early 1980's Nancy, along with husband Mike and their four children, were members of St. Mary's University Parish and the Faith Weavers.

She made significant contributions to her faith community, especially through her involvement with the Friends of El Salvador Committee. This included a memorable trip to the village of Miramar. While there she discussed ongoing and future projects that the Faith Weavers supported. She enjoyed the hospitality of the people of Miramar while staying with host families in the village.

Nancy was a lifelong educator in Idaho and Michigan for 30+ years. She taught for several years at Sacred Heart, followed by the Mt Pleasant Public Schools. Nancy loved spending time out-of-doors, camping, hiking, skiing, and spending time at the family cottage on Platte Lake.

Nancy was a kind and thoughtful person. She lived a life of giving to others, raising her children, and teaching her students to value generosity, kindness, and above all, love. She will be greatly missed by her family, friends, and the Faith Weavers community.

Charitable Giving in 2023

So far this year Faith Weavers has given \$52,155 in charitable outreach. Of this amount the Friends of El Salvador Committee has distributed \$20,150 for projects in El Salvador (see the related article in this newsletter on the Friends of El Salvador Committee). The Service and Justice Committee has distributed \$27,500 in grants to charitable organizations; \$1,800 has been given to St. Vincent DePaul Parish, and the remaining \$2,705 was given to charitable organizations to honor the priests who preside at Faith Weavers monthly gatherings.

The Service and Justice Committee continues to do an outstanding job of identifying organizations to receive our charitable grants. Two organizations were given first-time grants. St. Michael the Archangel Ukrainian Catholic Church was given \$2,500 to support the people of Ukraine (see related article in this newsletter), and \$3,000 was given to the Laman Afghan Foundation to give aid to the people of Afghanistan.

Grant to organizations supported in the past:

- A grant of \$6,000 was given to Global Compassion for construct of latrines and classroom furniture upgrades at the Azohoue-Cada School in Benin Africa.
- A \$2,500 grant to the Care Store to provide personal care and household products to local people in need.
- Connections that Count was given a grant for \$2,000 to support their programs for people in our community.
- World Kitchen was given a \$2,000 grant to help people suffering from natural disasters.

- Wings of Mercy given \$2,000 to provide flights for people who must travel to receive special medical care.
- The Josefino Orphanage in Mexico was given a \$3,500 grant. This grant was used for mattress pads, bedding, and towels for the children at the orphanage.
- Clothing Inc was given a grant for \$4,000 for clothing items for men in our community.

Spotlight on Ukraine Outreach

Glory be to Jesus Christ! Everyone here, at St. Michael Ukrainian Catholic Church, is very grateful for support from Faith Weavers. We appreciate your prayers and financial assistance. The \$2,500 grant was applied toward necessary purchases, such as medical supplies and the recent acquisition of an Italian ambulance vehicle. This vehicle serves as an ambulance for injured civilians and soldiers.

The invasion on February 24, 2022, generated shock and painful emotions as video emerged from family, friends, and news media. Parishioners arrived at St. Michael's that Thursday for a special service as Fr. Roman led them in prayer. Fundraising activities are constantly pursued as churches, homes, hospitals, and schools continue to be destroyed. The need for food, clothing, water, medicine, and money persists and we appreciate your generous donation.

"We are asking each of you to pray, and to pray that our families are looked over by God," Fr.

Roman said to the parishioners on that fateful February night. Please continue to pray – for family and friends sheltering in Ukraine and in foreign lands, and for those who have lost loved ones during this war.

Friends of El Salvador

At the winter meeting of the Friends of El Salvador Committee we evaluated project proposals and determined funding allocations. Since then, the primary activity has been closely monitoring funded projects. We are also working with our Salvadoran partners to identify needs and develop proposals for 2024.

For 2023 the total funding provided to beneficiaries is \$20,150. This money has been spent on the following projects.

Guajoyo School Projects

There were four school projects funded and completed this year. The unusable school kitchen has been beautifully renovated. It is used to prepare and distribute the daily meal nutritionally essential for many of the children. The quality and diversity of meals are being reinforced by a special "student meals" fund provided by the Friends of El Salvador Committee. This grant supplements the very small allocation of school dollars available for meals.

In one of the school buildings the crumbling walk and entrance, as well as the corridor and classroom floors, have been replaced after years of increasing damage from tree roots. The floors now have attractive tilework. Several trees have been removed. Smaller trees have been planted to create an attractive landscape with less potential to damage the floor as they grow.

Funding from the Committee has made possible recent purchases of a video projector, three LCD screens, and internet upgrades to support student learning. These purchases are part of a decade-long initiative by the school and the Committee to ensure a steady pace of technological development beyond the level possible in many Salvadoran schools. New musical instruments have also been added to bolster arts education.

Iris Cañas, School Director, stated recently that a visiting delegation from Spain was highly impressed and said so: they "never imagined seeing a Salvadoran rural school" making such excellent advances." Iris thanks Faith Weavers—yet again—for the on-going support for improving learning and student satisfaction at the Guajoyo School.

The Community of Miramar

Heri Cruz, our scholarship student in Miramar, reports that thirteen families are participating in the Poultry Project. In the first phase of the project, the community benefited from the good production of eggs and meat for family consumption. Also, newly hatched birds were available for sale. This initial phase of the project has concluded. A second phase is envisioned to engage additional families in systematic poultry production.

In recent weeks communication from Miramar has increasingly expressed alarm about the condition of many of the community's older latrines and the emerging threat posed to hygiene. Some are badly eroded and unusable, and most families cannot afford

to build new ones. Community leaders are surveying needs and developing a request for funding that will be evaluated by the Committee. The Friends of El Salvador last funded latrines for Miramar in spring 2018, when sixteen were built.

A couple weeks ago Heri passed along, once again, the community's deep and on-going gratitude for the support by Faith Weavers and the Cebelak Foundation of the water well (2019) and water tank (2020). He said the security of potable water access has been an immeasurably valuable gift to the community.

College Scholarships

Three university students are being funded through a grant by the Committee to the scholarship program in San Pedro Nonualco. Two students attend private universities in the capital of San Salvador. They receive a stipend of \$150 a month during the academic year for their expenses, including travel from San Pedro. The third student attends a public university online and receives \$75 a month for expenses.

This year the program has ten university students and six high school students who aspire to college study. All students are required to attend monthly meetings, participate in the program's field trips and book discussions, and maintain good academic progress.

Christmas Outreach has a lot of changes this year, but our mission and the way we will fulfill it is the same.

Our location will change. The Campus Life people are doing renovations in December and their building is not available. After a long search, **Morey Courts** stepped forward and offered their facility. However, to use their location, we are having Christmas Outreach later this year. We will be distributing on **December 15 and 16.**

We have Morey Courts only from December 13 through December 16, so our schedule is consolidated. We move in on December 13 and organize that afternoon and on Thursday, December 14. Please mark your calendars so you can help us on these two days. We will let you know just when we need help for filling stockings once we know.

Coats and Snow Pants

Again this year, we will need winter coats and snow pants for our guests. Faith Weavers members have generously contributed many new and gently used coats in past years. I encourage you to check your closets for gently used coats to donate. You can also buy a coat or two at Merchandise Mart, B2, Burlington or some other store.

As always, he needs more of the very large men's and women's plus and big/tall sizes. They cannot be too big.

Other Gift Items Needed

We need new and gently used <u>bedding</u> (queen size is the most in demand) and <u>towels</u>. We need <u>boots</u> in adult sizes.

I am in the process of transferring direction of the children's stockings to Sharon Wegner. She is making some healthy changes but keeping to the original intent of the stockings and gift bags.

Once again, we need your help with stocking stuffers. When so many of us had young children, we tried to focus our request on items children could buy for children. Now that we have fewer young children in our membership, I hope you will support our request for more teen and adult items. We are also trying to ask certain groups for particular items to better meet the participants' needs.

We are asking this year for adult toothpaste. We get small toothpaste for the kids and teens from local dentists, but we like to give a full-size tube to our adult guests. We are also asking for men's and women's shampoo/conditioner. Sometimes the men's is also a body wash.

Finally, we are asking for sippy cups. We provide these for very young children up to school age. We are hoping to get about 25 of each of these items from Faith Weavers. Of course, we welcome other items. For example, I know that several of you have purchased the back to school supplies we put in the children's stockings, and we still need them. We still want small stuffed animals to use as "toppers" for stockings. Beanie Babies work well for this if you have a collection to give away. Also, if there is some item you particularly want to donate, we welcome it. Feel free to talk with me if you have questions.

We continue to accept hotel- guest- size toiletries and we want your calendars. Do not buy the calendars. Just give us the ones you receive in the mail that you will not be using. They remain amazingly popular with our guests.

If you have purchased the items, you can bring them to our November12 Faith Weavers meeting. Since we are so late in distributing items this year, you can also bring them to our December 10 meeting.
